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
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## **FOREWORD**

During the national struggle for Independence particular attention was paid to the ancient and traditional crafts of India, both for the purpose of re-awakening pride in our heritage and for resuscitating skills and the economy of the country. After the attainment of independence, promotion of traditional crafts and small-scale industries came to be looked upon not only as an economic programme, but also as an ideological platform. In order to gain an insight into the economic and social structure of the country the Census of India took up a number of special studies as ancillary to the 1961 Census. In connection with this project it was felt necessary to compile two bibliographies—one relating to the small-scale and cottage industries of India and another relating to the arts and crafts of India. The first bibliography is already in the press, in the foreword to which I have outlined its genesis. The second bibliography is now presented. It will prove a very valuable aid not only to the special projects taken up by the Census organisation, but also to scholars interested in the study of the arts and crafts of India and elsewhere. I take this opportunity of expressing my appreciation of the useful work done by my colleagues Shri M. K. Pal and Shrimati Suman Chandna (Bhatia) under the guidance of Dr. B. K. Roy Burman.

## PREFACE

As an ancillary to 1961 Census, the Census Organisation undertook a project of conducting surveys on a number of traditional and rural crafts of India. The Handicrafts and Social Studies Unit in the Office of the Registrar General, India was constituted to co-ordinate these studies along with other studies. In this connection this Unit undertook a bibliographical survey so that the existing literature could be consulted as and when study on a particular craft was taken up. 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
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
