# *Introduction*

The present volume attempts to meet the need for a handbook describing existing sources of information in linguistics and certain related fields. It is intended principally for the student of linguistics at the upper undergraduate or graduate level. The established linguistic scholar can therefore scarcely expect to find here any great amount of unfamiliar material, though he may note with surprise or disapproval the inclusion or exclusion of particular titles.

## **COVERAGE**

The handbook attempts to provide coverage of all the major traditional fields in linguistics (e.g. descriptive, historical, phonology, grammar, dialectology, semantics, applied linguistics); of most of the major theoretical approaches to linguistic analysis (e.g. Prague School, tagmemics, transformational analysis); and of the major fields of linguistics and related disciplines (e.g. linguistics and anthropology, linguistics and psychology, linguistics and mathematics). But in order to stay within the prescribed limits of length, the compilers decided to reduce drastically the coverage of languages and groups of languages. Only "language families" or "areal groupings" have been covered (e.g. Germanic but not English; Oceanic but not Samoan), and here only major journals have been included. Thus the student whose main interest is in a particular language or languages of a particular family or area will have to turn to other sources.

Again, in order to stay within the limitations placed upon the length of the handbook, the compilers have in practically all cases sacrificed depth of coverage for variety. Certain kinds of material have been deliberately excluded as a result of decisions taken at the early stages of the work. Excluded are articles that have appeared in journals or other serial publications except when such articles constitute important sources of bibliography or history; *Festschriften*, because of their enormous numbers; and monograph series published outside the United States. But every effort has been made to retain what appears to be indispensable material in each of the subject fields represented.

Keeping in mind the person for whom this handbook is mainly intended, the American student of linguistics, the compilers have given particular attention to materials published in English, though due consideration has

been given to material in French, German, Russian, with some representation for other languages. Concern with the student also accounts for the presence of a number of textbooks, or books that are adaptable for classroom use.

#### ARRANGEMENT

The arrangement by subject has been used throughout, i.e. bibliographies, periodicals, surveys, and the like are listed with the individual subjects. Thus, a bibliography of phonetics is under *Phonetics and Phonemics* rather than "Bibliographies", and a journal dealing with anthropological linguistics is under *Anthropological Linguistics* instead of "Periodicals."

Categories like "bibliographies" and "periodicals" are here called form divisions, and while the types of materials vary in the different subject fields and not all types are found for all subjects, the same form divisions recur in many of the subject divisions of this handbook. With some slight variations as have seemed advisable under each subject, the form divisions are listed in the following order: Bibliographies; Periodicals; Monographs; Congresses and Proceedings; Maps, Atlases, Handbooks; Histories and Surveys; Theory and Method.

In this bibliography, complete bibliographical information for an entry is presented only once. A number in square brackets following a title is a cross reference to the principal entry.

At the end of the volume there is an author index.

#### ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

A preliminary version of this handbook was drafted by Valdis J. Zeps, now at the University of Wisconsin. Certain additions and emendations to that version were suggested by Miss Claire Asselin, working under the direction of Professor Eric P. Hamp of the University of Chicago. The present compilers developed a new scheme of organization of the handbook, with the result that portions of the earlier version were deleted and substantial amounts of new material added.

In the preparation of this volume the compilers have had the generous assistance of colleagues both at the Center for Applied Linguistics and elsewhere, who have willingly answered questions and made suggestions for its improvement. Particular thanks are due to Dr. Charles A. Ferguson, Director of the Center for Applied Linguistics, and to Dr. William W. Gage, research linguist on the Center staff and Acting Director of the Languages Program. Thanks are also due to Dr. Martin Joos of the University of Wisconsin, who was Visiting Director at the Center as the work was reaching its final stages. Finally, grateful acknowledgement is made to the National Science Foundation for its support of this handbook through a grant (NSF-18866) to the Center for Applied Linguistics.
